CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

The ConnectGroups Board's main focus in the 2011/2012 financial year has been transitioning the organisation to Peak Body status. This strategic shift is a reflection of the maturity of the organisation as well as its capacity to provide a service and governance harbour for our diverse member groups and be the voice of the Self Help and Support Group area of the Not For Profit sector.

The Board has been in continuous strategic mode to fulfil this agenda and this work continues. That strength is reflected in the quality of the Directors on the Board including members who joined the Board in the 2011/2012 financial year. An initiative/forum provided by the Institute of Company Directors to bring together prospective Board Directors and organisations with Board opportunities provided ConnectGroups with two candidates of a high quality; one of which is Garry Jacobs (now Treasurer) whose current Financial Report illustrates the quality of fiscal management that ConnectGroups is known for.

Much activity in the NFP sector has related to the funding provisions of the last State Budget and its procurement reform. Of note is the simplification and streamlining regarding the managements of service agreements. The funding has had benefits for organisations previously stretched in their abilities to deliver services and retain good staff with much viability pressures now lifted so that NFP Boards can focus on the core functions of strategy, governance and sustainability. The work of the new ACNC will sharpen the work of Boards as it begins overseeing registration, standards, compliance and accreditation in the sector.

Our partnership approach continues to be a strength for ConnectGroups and was recently acknowledged by and supported with funds from the Mental Health Commission; who appointed ConnectGroups to broker funds to Self Help and Support Groups across WA. This is an exciting initiative that adds welcome value to our core funding from the Department of Communities and Lotterywest.

I would like to thank the Board, CEO and Staff of ConnectGroups for another year of disciplined service delivery and outstanding outcomes that keep our members at the centre of what we do.

I look forward to continuing to contribute to the health and mental health wellbeing of the WA community.



PROJECTS

2011 Commonwealth People's Forum - WACOSS

On the 25th October ConnectGroups ran a Learning Journey session for the CHOGM delegates. The Learning Journey presented the nature and role of support groups and the positive impact they have and/or have the potential to have on “Culture, Identity, Peace and Security” at both a community and individual level.

This interactive session aimed to “promote the philosophy, concept and practice of self-help within Western Australia and to facilitate its development and effectiveness by educating, linking, and empowering individuals, families, and groups to meet their specific needs.

The Pay It Forward Plan - Mental Health Commission

Based on the results of the 2011 National Awareness Day Symposium, ConnectGroups initiated conversations with the Mental Health Commission around accessing funds and engaging in a brokerage role which would see a system of funding driven by the ‘grass-root’ needs of Self Help and Support Groups as well as being centrally processed in an equitable way. The Mental Health Commission also recognised the significance that:

- Self Help and Support Groups require recurrent funding for their security and sustainability; and
- Mental health issues are overarching issues that impact on all Self Help and Support Groups, their members, families, friends and carers.

PROJECTS

Self Help & Support Groups Care Package - Mental Health Commission

This study opportunity is being offered to ConnectGroups members who are currently facilitating Self Help & Support Groups. ConnectGroups, together with the Mental Health Commission will be offering 20 full scholarships to those individuals who would like to formalise their facilitation skills.

HAVoC Hope After Violent Crime - Lotterywest

This study was established to look at the support services available to victims of crime in WA. The aim of HAVoC is to develop a Best-Practice Model of Group Support for Victims of Violent Crime in Western Australia.

Initially conceived by Dr Ann O'Neil, founder and director of angelhands, the project is being managed by ConnectGroups with a consortium of 5 organisations participating in the collection of data.

Road Trauma - Direction

After participating in the research around existing Aboriginal Road Trauma Services in WA and as part of its participation in the Road Trauma Support Service Research reference group, ConnectGroups decided to direct a Road Trauma Support Group . This Support Group is open to anyone who is affected by Road Trauma – directly or indirectly. This includes survivors, family members, friends, Emergency Services Officers (as individuals) and anyone who feels they are affected by any Road Trauma incident. The group offers support, information & advocacy around road trauma issues.

ConnectGroups Consultative Group

The Consultative Group was established in 2012, in line with CG's 2011 Blue Print "Towards Good Practice" and Consumer engagement strategy. The role of the Consultative Group has been to advise and make recommendations as to our service delivery and policy development for the benefit of our member groups. It has been working closely with us, contributing with input into our research projects, events, advocacy programs and grant initiatives. Essentially representing Self Help and Support Groups at a grass root level bringing to our attention their needs and any opportunities which we could then action.

Act Belong Commit

In 2012 ConnectGroups became a local partner of the Act-Belong-Commit Program. ABC is a community-based health promotion campaign that encourages people to take action to improve their mental health and wellbeing. This evidence-based campaign was developed primarily from research undertaken by Curtin University into people's perceptions of mental health and the behaviours they believed protected and promoted good mental health. The campaign is directed by Mentally Healthy WA at Curtin University, and implemented through health services, local governments, women's health services and not-for-profit groups.

Multicultural Mental Health Service Providers Group

The Committee's main focus is information sharing specific to Multicultural Mental Health Services. The committee members are primarily from agencies whose core target group are those from Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Backgrounds. 2012 saw the development of a 'Mental Health Needs and Spirituality in Diverse Communities' document following a consultative process with spiritual leaders from different religious groups.
